Our key text this term is 'Floodland' by Marcus Sedgwick. In reading sessions, we will be learning to summarise texts as well as discussing and evaluating the impact an author's language choices have on the reader. In writing we will be focussing on selecting the appropriate form to meet the identified audience and purpose of the writing.

Religious Education

We will be learning about 'The Kingdom of God' and exploring what this means to Christians.

PSHE

As the children prepare to start their new secondary schools, we will be focussing on dealing with change and also talking about careers.


Mathematics

In the final term, Year 6 will be applying their mathematical knowledge to solve a wide range of problems, including increasingly complex properties of numbers and arithmetic, and problems demanding efficient written and mental methods of calculation. Through a range of investigative activities, children will refine their ability to work systematically, spot patterns and create rules.

Science— Electricity

Children will learn how to compare and give reasons for how components function (including the brightness of bulbs, the loudness of buzzers and different types of switches). They will use recognised symbols when representing a simple circuit in a diagram. Throughout the term, there will be lots of opportunities for practical, hands-on investigation and exploration.

Humanities—Geography

Our Geography learning will be closely linked to our topic 'Mission Survival'. We will be using the eight points of a compass to navigate and learning to read Ordnance Survey maps (using six figure grid-references and identifying symbols and keys).

Art: During this term's art lessons, children will work in groups to plan, prepare and deliver their own mini-art project to their peers.

Music: Children will be rehearsing a range of songs in preparation for their end of year production and leavers services.

Physical Education

We will be focussing on a range of athletics skills including running, jumping and throwing in preparation for Sports Day.

We will be developing our striking and fielding skills through the game of rounders.

Computing

Children will be developing their ability to use word-processing programmes. Also we will be learning how to use technology safely, respectfully and responsibly and recognising and identifying acceptable and unacceptable content and contacts.
